



VALENTINE VIEWPOINT

A Message from a guest writer Rev Chris Burr of St Denys' Church, Lisvane

What is Love?

AND YOU THOUGHT IT WAS JUST AN **ANONYMOUS GREETINGS CARD FOR** SOMEONE YOU LOVE ...

t is almost Valentine's Day once again but I wonder how many know where its roots lie?

In the English language there is but one word for love but in Greek — the language of the New Testament — there are actually four and each means something quite different.

'Philia' portrays the often powerful bond of love and loyalty shared between friends and family.

'Storge' meanwhile describes the arguably unique love and natural empathy of a parent towards their children.

Most of us, however, would imagine that St Valentine's Day is a celebration of a rather different type of love something more romantic or passionate.

But actually if we look at St Valentine himself, the patron of this particular day, we find that our celebration is grounded in something else altogether.

St Valentine — although we don't know much about him - was a Christian martyr who helped Christians during the persecution under Claudius II. Valentine would perform marriages for Christians, which was totally forbidden, and generally worked to protect and help followers of Christ. For this he was duly arrested, clubbed, stoned and ultimately beheaded. For this he was ultimately canonised and became known as 'St Valentine of Rome'.

Valentine comes from the term *valens* meaning *worthy*, strong, powerful and St Valentine certainly proved a brave follower of Jesus, who stood up for love and truth and gave his life for the gospel.

And that rather better represents the Biblical image of God's love for us and our call to similarly love him. The Greek word often used to portray God's love is 'Agape' which is born out of commitment and sacrifice most evident, of course, in Jesus' sacrificial death on the Cross.

Arguably the most famous Bible verse (John 3 v 16) depicts this amazing and committed love that God has for

Punctuate your life — full stop

What was it my wife said the other day? It was something unusual.

"If I don't go to church on Sunday then my week is without punctuation."

What she meant I had no idea.

Is there a link between time and controlling the ways in which we speak and write and give meaning and significance to the words we use? Punctuation has to do with speaking and writing but it can be changed in a passage and meaning and understanding is altered.

Has this anything to do with what my wife said?

There are many punctuation marks. Could she have been referring to each one? Surely not. What does going to church have to do with apostrophes, hyphens, asterisks, ellipses?

Nothing surely.

Following a brief period for silent meditation I realised what she had meant: the punctuation marks indicating a pause in a passage. She meant the full stop. a colon: the semi-colon; the comma,

Going to church was a break in the weekly time-line; a pause in the way she lived her life day after day. Many people complain that life's repeating patterns are

boring and they need a break. Does my wife feel like that? Is so, then church on Sunday is the day of change. What is the old saying? A change is a good as a rest. There's a break in the routine. There's newness, renewal, refreshment. Dare I say it? Variety is the spice of life.

God knew what he was doing when, on the seventh day of creation, he rested. In Exodus 20 v 8 we read,

"Observe the Sabbath and keep it Holy. You have six days in which to do your work but the seventh day is a day of rest dedicated to me."

So my wife has put a vivid personal interpretation on the Fourth Commandment. Keeping the Fourth Commandment refreshes her life as a whole and inspires each and every day. The pause punctuates her life. The day of rest refreshes and invigorates all of life around her.

Praise God for the full stop — and the comma of Thursday also (such as for our 30-minute service in Bethany). A break and a rest are not just a brief cessation of work but are a spur to carry on — renewed.

To lay aside your work for a brief period is helpful but remember it is a time

to worship the Lord. Worship breaks do matter; they replenish life. Rest in the Lord — wait patiently for him.

Review your Punctuation. Full stop.
